Ukraine

- For churches/leaders to remain trusting in Christ
- Pray for ongoing support of refugees and displaced women, children and vulnerable adults particularly in Moldova, Poland and surrounding countries
- For resources to continue providing long term support for Ukrainian families who hope to be reunited with their male relatives fighting inside Ukraine
- Pray for peace and an end to hostilities with Russia
- For grain supplies out of Ukraine. For northern Ethiopia, Zimbabwe and other nations affected by the food shortage
- For the knock-on effects of the conflict : famine, trauma, infrastructure, people movements
